## A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

In 1879, the city was home to less than 200,000 people; Union Station was not yet built; and electric lights were just being introduced to the streets of Toronto. Fast forward 135 years. Toronto is a world class city and ranked as the fourth most livable. Yet the need for organizations like TCM has not diminished. Vital statistics that measure Toronto's health, such as the growing income gap, show a city with people of great needs. As we enter our 135th year of serving Toronto, TCM continues to work with the strength of God to be a source of transformation in our city.

Four years into my six-year term, I continue to be both proud and humbled as Chair of TCM. I am proud of the families that have been transformed positively by TCM, yet humbled by the dedication that staff and volunteers show in carrying out their work. TCM is making a real impact in Toronto, and with the launch of afterschool programs in the Kingston-Galloway area last October, TCM is leading the way to provide transformational help to a diverse community in the city. Furthermore, TCM has identified other areas of needs in the city and is dedicated to filling these needs. We are expanding our Role Model Moms program and are continually evaluating how we can best serve our communities.

In June of this past year, we announced Andrew Schell's retirement plans. In addition, we are also preparing for Steve Chu's retirement in the coming year. We are grateful that both Andy and Steve will help ensure a smooth transition for the new Executive Director.

As a result, the Board has been busy this past year. Our Search Committee has been hard at work, and together with the Board as a whole, aim to identify our new Executive Director for next year. Moreover, we committed last year to help raise \$100,000 on an annual basis. We knew this would not be an easy task when we took on the challenge, but I believe that our board can make it happen within the next couple of years. We continue to trust in God to provide the needed resources to support our ministry.

We will be going through a transition period in the next couple of years – I am excited to see what God has in store for us. Our staff and volunteers are experienced and poised to become the spiritual and transformative leaders of our city. The Board and I are blessed to be along for the journey.

# Leaders

Toronto City Mission is dedicated to building LEADERS in our city.

<u>Volunteers and Interns:</u> Every staff member invests in our volunteers and interns and in return these LEADERS give back to their city and are role models to the community members we serve.

Community Leaders: We intentionally mentor and equip children, youth, and adults to become LEADERS in their own communities. We seek to teach Christ's example of servant LEADERSHIP (John 13:12-16) in all of our programs and to encourage individuals to know their gifts and give back to their communities.

### Q: How long have you been a part of TCM?

Celine: I have been with TCM for 8 years and have been a part of KIC (Kids in Community), EPIC (Education Provided in Community) Tutoring, Junior Extreme and soon Youth Extreme.

Matthew: I have been a part of TCM for a year and a half. I am a part of the Junior Extreme Program.

## Q: Celine, What have you learned from being a TLC?

I've learned to become more considerate and understanding of the children. I have gained more leadership skills and this has all impacted my life in the way I act around children. This program also gave me my first job. I've also learned to be more on time in the morning.

O: What does it mean to be a leader in your community?

### Q: What is your favourite memory about being a leader?

Celine: All my favourite memories are the fun times. One time a kid wanted cookies and instead of calling the leader's name, he called them, "Cookie! Cookie!" The kid later on corrected himself by saying the leader's name while laughing.

Matthew: Well, I haven't been a leader for too long, but so far I really like interacting with the kids.

### Q: What have you learned about Christ?

Celine: I have learned so many things about Christ through our daily morning devotions. I have learned more about His wisdom and love.

Matthew: I have learned that He is a righteous leader.




# Preventative & Transformational Programs

Our programs are the platform on which relationships are formed. We help children, youth, and adults rise above poverty by providing PREVENTATIVE PROGRAMS. Our PROGRAMS are designed to equip them to make wise choices about school, friends, relationships, work, and the future. The objective is that each individual would gain self-confidence and maximize the use of their God given gifts (1 Pet 4:10). They also are encouraged to demonstrate a changed life by giving those gifts back to their communities in the form of service to their families, friends, neighbours, and co-workers.



- KIC Kids in Community (After School Program)
  - During KIC, children Grades 1-6 engage in positive activities with each other to build constructive and healthy relationships. These activities include games, sports, stories, Bible lessons, music, and crafts.
- EPIC Education Provided in Community (Tutoring) Dedicated volunteer tutors meet with their matched child once each week. The results are obvious... children's grades improve, they become more confident, and develop a joy of learning.
- TLC Teens Leading Communities (Leadership Program) TLC brings youth from the neighbourhood together and helps them develop leadership skills as they serve their own community through summer camps and KIC.
- Sonshine Day Camp (during March Break & Summer) TCM offers five Sonshine Day Camps and two Junior Extreme Camps in Toronto. We provide fun summer activities and
- share God's love with almost 200 children each week. RMM - Role Model Moms
- TCM partners with The Sprott Foundation to provide Role Model Moms. We have the privilege of helping moms pass their General Education Equivalency Exam and thus take a huge step toward improving the quality of their lives.
- Youth Extreme Youth Extreme provides a positive environment for junior high and high school aged youth to socialize, build healthy relationships, and enjoy activities such as games, movies, and Bible studies. This program provides a safe place for young people to dialogue about faith issues and to learn leadership skills.




# **Our Leadership**

### Steve Chu **Director of Ministries**



# Looking to the Future

### Dear Friends,

In last year's report I described our involvement in a World Vision strategic leadership program called Free-Form. We have now completed this program and have revised our long term strategy accordingly. You will notice many similar elements from last year and this is intentional. We are not deviating from our core purpose and approach so much as strengthening our focus on what matters most and having clear action steps to accomplish our vision which states;

"Families, impacted by poverty, will lead transformed lives."

To do this, we will act in six areas:

- 1. Leadership Team: Implement an effective transition plan to new leadership
- 2. Program Capacity: Align all programs to meet our new Vision and Mission
- 3. Human Resource Strategy: Ensure staff levels meet the core program needs
- 4. Strategy and Planning: Develop and implement a 'TCM awareness' campaign
- 5. Resource Development: Meet program funding needs in all five sites
- 6. Financial Stewardship: Link strategy to all program commitments as well as provide detailed, balanced budgets

This is a simple synopsis of the focus over the next two to three years. There are many more detailed steps in our strategy that can be found on our website. Ultimately our aim is to serve families impacted by poverty and to bring them hope through the knowledge of Christ and His love for them.

As Houston has already mentioned, this will be my last annual report. I am extremely grateful that God led me to TCM and I want to thank all the volunteers, staff and board who have given me their support over eight years. May God continue to richly bless TCM and all who are associated with this important ministry.
